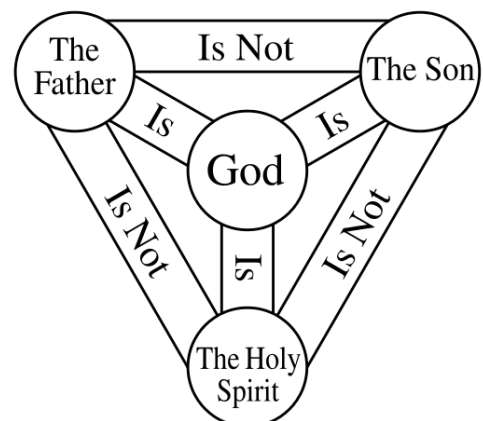

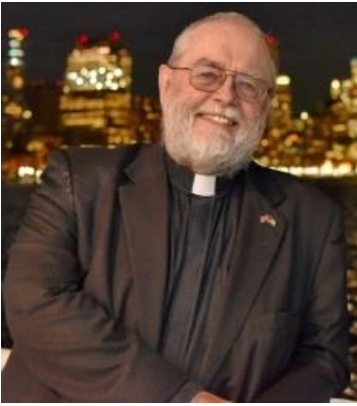
1 – A family may serve as Ministers of Hospitality. Adults are required to be present but children may certainly help in welcoming and passing out materials.

CLOTHES DRYER TIP

I pass this on from someone who is a fireman, and says that fires starting in clothes dryers is a leading cause of house fires.

When my heating unit went out on our dryer, the Fix-It guy that I called went into the dryer and pulled out the lint filter. It appeared to be clean. We always clean the lint from the filter after every load of clothes. He took the filter over to the sink and ran hot water over it.

Now, this thing is like a mesh, WELL ... the hot water just laid on top of the mesh!!! It didn't go through it at all!!! He told us that dryer sheets cause a film over that mesh and that's what burns out the heating unit. You can't SEE the film, but it's there. He said the best way to keep your clothes dryer working for a very long time is to take that filter out and wash it with hot soapy water and an old toothbrush (or other brush) at least every six months. He said that makes the life of the dryer at least twice as long! Based on what I saw, I think I would do it more frequently.

I could do a reflection here about the need to make sure our souls are clean as well – certainly confession should be on the maintenance list at least as frequently as a clothes dryer. Our souls don't burn out, but just as the film on the mesh makes it hard for the heat to get through, so sin on our souls makes it hard for God's grace to make an impression.

Which is an example of the saying of St. Ignatius, "Find God in all things." I made a button once, FIGIAT, to remind people of this valuable exercise, this important way of looking at life. There are reminders of God all around us, there are lessons we can draw from the simplest events and activities, there is evidence of God's grace if we pay attention and look for it.

During this coming week, treat each day like a treasure hunt. When we go on a treasure hunt, we know the treasure is there, and sometimes we even have a map. In the same way, we know that God's grace is there in the world around, we know God's hand is in the world each day, we know there are lessons to be learned. Each day try and find at least one "treasure," one moment when you and God connect. It can be as simple as being struck by the beauty of a flower and how God's hand is reflected in the complexity of the design of the blossom. It can be watching someone do something and learning something about yourself. It can be enjoying a memory of a past moment in your life, and realizing that this past event can teach you something about today.
