

# RAMBLINGS

### FROM THE REVEREND REDACTOR

I need some advice. I am looking for a printer who does good color work, precise, able to handle simple binding and not outrageously expensive. I am thinking of a particular job and need to get one or more estimates to see if it is something we can afford. Recommendations are most welcome. I'd love to be able to have this as an item for the September 12 meeting for group discussion about things to do with the parish.

It's human nature, isn't it? We can search the Internet for shops or businesses, read online reports – but we tend to trust first of all recommendations from those we know. It is pretty much true for everything in life, including faith. More people are brought to faith because of friends they know who are believers than by all the television programs, email campaigns and paid advertising put together. The earliest converts, we are told in the Acts of the Apostles, came to believe because they saw the Christians and how they loved one another. That was what impressed them, that was what made them want to be a part of that community.

September?!!? Next week is September??!! Wait – what happened to July, and August? I had great plans for those months, for all that "extra" time. I was going to exercise more, and explore Amman more, and really really work on my Arabic and.... What happened? I suspect that is a reaction that many of us can share at this time of the year, when time seems to slip by and things start up again and our To Do list has not gotten any shorter. That too is human nature, and while it can be frustrating – and a word from where I sit, as you get older, time tends to go by even more swiftly.

But it only gets serious when we think about the things of God, the items we "meant to do" on our path to salvation. When we sit and reflect on where did the summer go, it's usually not something of great importance. When we look at our lives – especially as we get older – and we wonder where the time went, it suddenly becomes much more serious. And because we never know when God will call us, putting things off until we are older, until we retire, until we have more free time, is never a safe proposition.

We can't make up for the things we missed over the last several months (although for the record I AM spending more time on my Arabic). We can give God more of our time and energy and commitment while we still can. No matter how busy our schedules, how complicated our lives, somehow we are always able to fit in the things that are most important for us. The trick is to make sure that God is on that list of things that are "most important."

Let us continue to pray for one another.


