PLEASE REGISTER!!!


There are usually registration slips at the back of the Church. There are four ways to register:

RAMBLINGS

FROM THE REVEREND REDACTOR

When I was in the Jesuit Novitiate (a 2-year program) we were required to change our rooms every six months. It was a useful exercise, both to make us aware of how much "stuff" we had accumulated, and to help us be detached about where we lived. (That was harder; in a Syracuse winter, with snow up to your knees, living in the main house was much nicer than in one of the houses down the block and up the hill). We were never sure if the room assignments were random, or if the fine hand of the Novice Master had some deep

psychological or spiritual plan.

I am reminded of those days as, for the third time in about two years, I am preparing to move. It's not a big move, I am moving from the bottom floor of the Jesuit Center to the roof. Now that the renovation and construction is finished, the room on the top has been refurbished and I will be its first – and hopefully long-term – occupant. It will give me the privacy to be able to sing more (without disturbing my Jesuit brothers) and will add an extra flight of stairs, which will hopefully help in the continuing fight to develop straight lines in my body where nature seems determined to maintain curves.

As I prepare to once again re-organize my belongings and my schedule, I find myself thinking that this moving business is still a good thing. And not just for me, but for us all. Not that we should all pack and move on a regular basis, although many in our parish community do precisely that as part of their work and their lifestyles. It is good to keep track of what we have and if we own our belongings or if our belongings own us. It is good to be free enough to go to another place, whether two flights of stairs up or two airplane flights to the other side of the world. It doesn't mean we don't love the things we have, the people we are with or the places where we hang out hats. But we need to reminded occasionally that there is a greater scope of existence in which these are not the most important items.

When I was in grammar school, I was the proud possessor of a card I kept in my wallet. (In grammar school I had very little else to keep in my wallet.) It said (and I apologize for the language but this is what it said) "When you are up to your ass in alligators, it is difficult to remember that your initial objective was to drain the swamp."

In our daily lives, when all too often we are up to our neck in problems and pressures and schedules and commitments, it is sometimes difficult to remember that no matter where we live or what we are doing, our ultimate destination is heaven and our most important work is getting there, and helping others find their way as well. There are moments when life reminds us: the birth of a baby, the death of a loved one, a medical diagnosis that changes our life. Regular attendance at Mass is certainly a help, but each of us needs to find the personal ways to keep that goal alive. For me, apparently, God wants to help me by making me pack and move and pack and move until I get it right. What works for you?

Let us continue to pray for one another.
