Weekly rosary at DeLaSalle before the Sunday Mass

October is one of two months during the year specially dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Because the Mass begins promptly at 6:00 PM, we need to start the Rosary exactly at 5:30.

A CHANGE FOR THE JESUIT COMMUNITY

On Friday, October 6, in addition to being First Friday, a change will be taking place. The Jesuit Community in Amman, currently under the authority of the Upper North East (UNE) Province of the United States Assistancy, will, on that date, transfer to the authority of the Middle East Province, with Provincial Offices in Beirut. The American Jesuits in Amman will remain here, and will remain members of the UNE Province, but under the Provincial of the Middle East Province. The UNE Province will continue to provide financial support for this work until 2022. We do not foresee any immediate change in what we are doing, but we felt you should know.

CLASSES FOR FIRST HOLY COMMUNION

Classes in preparation for First Holy Communion will be starting soon. Any parent who did not attend the required meeting with Father John and who wants to have their child receive these instructions needs to be in contact with him immediately. Families need to be registered in the Parish and before a child can begin the instruction, there is a required meeting with the Pastor for the parents, and another with the child. Once classes have begun, late entrance will be allowed only with the special permission of the Pastor.



RAMBLINGS OF THE REVEREND REDACTOR

Last week after Mass at Sweifieh, a young lady came up with her mother and said, "I want to help. What can I do?" She is five years old.

So I told her she and her family could bring the gifts to the altar at Mass. I said that she (with her mother standing by) could help pass out the newsletter Heartbeat at the end of Mass, as people were leaving. When we have our next reception, there will be a table right by the door where people get stickers and write their name — I said she could help at that table, making people feel welcome and asking them to write their name on a sticker. I told her no one could refuse that request from her.

Her name is Sophia, which means wisdom. And in her 5-year old wisdom, she wanted to help, to do whatever she could to be a part of this community. I didn't ask her why, what prompted this generous offer – but I did rejoice a little in my heart.

I'm hoping she is not the only one. In this issue of Heartbeat, I am asking if there is a desire among parents of children NOT preparing for First Communion for a catechism class. If the answer is that parents do want something more for their children – and I would hope ALL would – then I ask who might be the teachers. You don't need a degree or special training. You DO need a love for God and a willingness to learn and a desire to share. We'll give you the materials and help.

In this issue there is also a schedule of workshops for Lectors (for those who missed the last ones) and for Ministers of Hospitality (which is a more serious and necessary part of our coming together than most people realize), and for men who would like to be Eucharistic Ministers. I'm asking if anyone is interested in being an altar server to let me know, so we can figure out a time for a training workshop for that Ministry – and it is not a service in the Church that is restricted to young people. With what I hope will be a large reception on October 21, after the Mass for Jesuit Alumni and Friends, I know that more people will be needed to help plan and make this event happen.

Finally, it is time to see if the Casual Christmas Choir is something that is possible. Casual, because there is no commitment other than coming together to prepare music for the Christmas Masses and the Christmas season. If we get good enough, we might visit a nursing home or a hospital or some other venue to share the sound of the season. I'd like the group to be available to sing at all the Christmas Masses in both churches. It all depends on people being interested and available.

Sophia set the standard – I want to help, what can I do? Hopefully that same desire lives in the hearts of more people and if so – now is time to respond. The ultimate question and answer in our lives is – God, why don't you DO something? And God answers – I did. I sent you.

Let us continue to pray for one another.

WHAT CAN YOU DO TO HELP?

If you would like to be more involved in the life of the Parish, consider signing up for one of the following ministries, and attending the necessary workshop. Even if you have been volunteering in one of these areas, you do need to take the workshop, so that everyone has the same understanding of what is required. **PLEASE** let us know if you are coming so we can provide enough material for all.

LECTOR – To proclaim the Word of God in Church is a special calling, and the Lector must have some training both in HOW to proclaim and the spirituality behind this work. One session of up to two hours (depending on the number of candidates involved).

EXTRAORDINARY MINISTER OF THE EUCHARIST – Our

Parish has a special dispensation from the Bishop to have Extraordinary Ministers who can help at Mass and bring the Eucharist to the sick. Because of the special nature of this calling, there are two workshops required. In this Diocese, this is only open to men. Candidates may attend either session of A and B, but must attend one of each.

MINISTER OF HOSPITALITY – Minister of Hospitality has the responsibility both to make all who come to Church feel welcome, but also to help insure their safety and comfort. One session of around 90 minutes, depending on how many attend the session.
