

RAMBLINGS OF THE REVEREND REDACTOR

I usually try to keep the Ramblings and my weekly column on the website separate, with different messages. This week, I feel the website message is important enough to repeat here. If you have already read it – good for you. If you have not, then my decision is justified.

When I was a child, I thought as a child.... and so forth. I assume you can finish the rest of that quote and you know where it comes from.

If you can't - then perhaps I am speaking particularly to you. Several times this week, in conversations with different people in different places, people said to me (and I promise you, I did not bring the topic up) that we have a serious problem in our Church and it is a lack of proper catechetical education in both adults and young people. It was said to me (again, several times) that our Catholics don't know enough (in some cases anything) about our faith, and that we can too easily become like a cult, blindly following, without knowing WHY we do things, or WHAT we believe, or WHY we believe them.

I am not anxious to make more work for myself. But when I was installed as Pastor I made a series of solemn promises before the Bishop, and one of them was (and I quote) "to exercise the ministry of the word worthily and wisely, preaching the Gospel and teaching the Catholic faith." It seems I am caught. Our First Communion classes are underway and we will shortly begin Confirmation classes. That leaves two groups of people in the parish for whom, at the moment, there is no opportunity for further growth in the faith, in a formal way: children who are not preparing to receive sacraments, and adults.

Parents pretty much have to make the decision on behalf of their children, so if there is a desire for catechism class (or classes, depending on age and numbers) I need to hear about it. Adults have to make their own decision - but if you do not feel you have an ADULT understanding of your faith, and how it interacts with the day to day problems and conflicts and controversies you encounter, or worse, if you feel you don't NEED any additional knowledge about the faith, I would suggest in either case that you are PRECISELY the audience I need to talk to.

But I can do nothing alone. I am willing to schedule my time into forever, if people are interested, or even just a little uncomfortable. Let me know if this is something we should pursue and we will - together - arrive at how (what kind of form will classes take) and when (which given all the activities to which you have already committed yourself and your children is not always an easy task) and I will then search for the people who can work with me to do some of this.

On October 28 and 29th I will be celebrating a Narrated Mass, which will explain some of the elements of our common worship, where they came from and why we do what we do. (More about that next week.) But that is a once a year event, and while interesting and educational, it does not take the place of a regular program of reading and discussion and sharing the elements of our faith. Think about it. Pray about it. Talk with others. And let me know. Let us continue to pray for one another.
