## FOR DECEMBER The Future of the Very Young

That every country take the measures necessary to prioritize the future of the very young, especially those who are suffering.





When I was living in Nigeria, one December I found myself thinking, "It's starting to feel like Christmas." Then I caught myself – what in the world was I thinking? The temperature was about 32 degrees Celsius, it was humid (Lagos is right on the ocean) and the air was filled with the Harmattan dust, the very fine dust that blows down from the Sahara each year. People were poor, there was a dictatorship in place and things were NOT getting better.

When I was growing up, Christmas meant snow and cold weather and layers of clothing and presents and shopping – and none of this was going on. I realized, after a little thought, that it was the dust. Each year I had been in Africa, the Christmas preparations and the dust came together. And as I reflected, I realized that there was still a sense of Christmas. People didn't have money but they still bought small gifts, especially for the children. Because they couldn't spend money, they spent time making decorations, or visiting one another, going to Church and singing carols at every opportunity.

Christmas – the real Christmas – the deep meaning of Christmas – should not depend on weather or finances or clothing. It is perhaps the ultimate celebration of love – the love that God the Father has for His Creation that is so great that His only Son was sent to save us.

He came, and He did what He was sent for. THAT act of salvation is history, and we rejoice in it. Of course, our own salvation is not yet assured, not guaranteed – because OUR act of salvation is still in process. Jesus Christ saved us – now we have to accept His invitation and save ourselves. Every day that He was alive, Jesus was working for our salvation. Our call is the same as His; every day of our lives we must be working for our salvation as well.

Our call is the same as His. We are not working just for our own salvation, but we are also called to save one another. To pray and work and share and support and teach and welcome and love one another, as we bring the Kingdom of God closer to reality. Just as He did. Most of us don't work miracles – or at least, not the big miracles that everyone notices and that draw crowds. We work with the gifts we have. It can be cooking, or teaching, sewing or being a help to people who need help. It can be as simple as listening when someone needs someone to hear them, and I am quite sure that those who pray are perhaps the greatest force for God's work in the world today that there is.

This is a special time of the year, as we focus on preparing for one of the most extraordinary events in the history of the world. God became man when Mary said "Yes" to the angel. God was born into the world in the stable in Bethlehem. John the Baptist was also sent to prepare the way, Simeon recognized Him in the Temple, Herod tried to kill Him before he could grow – the stories are wonderful. Angels singing, Kings coming to worship – it was an extraordinary entrance into the world. The world has not been the same since then, although in some ways better and some ways perhaps discouraging. But the act of salvation isn't over, and our call it the same as His. We are called to change the world. And this is the season when we get the chance to step back, and prepare – and celebrate what God has already done.

And let us continue to pray for one another.


#### **2020 CALENDARS**
