LENTEN ACTIVITIES


A Preliminary Look at Some Activities during the Lenten Season. Suggestions for other Lenten activities or practices are always welcome.

Lenten Reflections – A weekly gathering to share reflections and explore the history and meaning of Lent. Each Saturday at the Jesuit Center, following the 8:30 Mass, from February 24 until March 31. All are welcome, no reservation necessary.

Daily Reflections during Lent – Available on request by email, and also available on the Parish Group page on Facebook. Those who have received them in the past will be automatically on the email list. Email Fr. John if you want to be added to the list.

Lenten Day of Recollection – Friday, March 9 - 8:30 AM (Morning Mass) until approximately 4. Lunch is included. No charge for the day, but advance reservations **are** required. Fr. John and Fr. Robert will share the day.

During Lent we will also be conducting the "Scrutinies" for the Catechumens, and on March 3rd, the First Communion candidates will receive the Sacrament of Roonciliation for the first time. That ceremony will begin promptly at 4 PM in St. Mary of Nazareth Church, and all are invited to come and pray with the young people. A priest will also be available to hear confessions of adults while the candidates are making their First Confessions.



RAMBLINGS OF THE REVEREND REDACTOR

Some of you may know that my "totem" animal is the rhinoceros. I adopted it in 1966 and through the many intervening years, this strange animal has continued to pop up in my life, and has often provided an answer to friends who could NOT find a present and who resorted to various kind of "rhinocerotica."

But some have suggested that while the rhinoceros is unusual, a bull dog might be more accurate. A bull dog is known for his unwillingness to not let go. He was bred to grab a bull by the snout, and hang on. While I try to <u>not</u> associate with bulls, it is true that I sometimes have difficulty letting go, especially of ideas.

And so in this issue, in addition to the schedule of workshops for Lectors and Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist, and another appeal for volunteers to become Altar Servers, you will find a meeting scheduled under the title "Music Ministry." Yes, Father John is once again going to see if we can generate enough interest in praising God in song to put together a regular group to help lead the singing and teach the congregation new songs from time to time, as well as creating special moments for Holy Week and other liturgies.

I would hope that people would take a chance. Unless you have studied, don't tell me you "can't sing." If you truly can't, I'll tell you. I might be able to help you sing better. I'd love for other musicians to come forward as well. I know we have at least one pianist in the congregation, at least one trumpet player, a flute player – and these are just ones I happen to know of in passing.

There will be a meeting on Tuesday, February 13 at the Jesuit Center, to see if there is enough interest to go forward. One of the items will be when we should meet, so if Tuesday is NOT a good day – please make an effort to come to this meeting and we will try to find that works for most of the people.

St. Augustine said that "He who sings prays twice." When I started to sing as Cantorial soloist at the Jewish Temple, Rabbi Rosenstock told me, "The rabbi leads the minds to God. The Cantor leads the hearts to God. Both are necessary." Our worship is more meaningful when the music is rich and reflects both the prayer and the congregation. Since we come from so many different backgrounds and cultures, we need to work a little harder than many churches do at finding the right music and making it a part of our routine. But it is worth the effort, and I invite and encourage you (yes, YOU!) to step forward and be a part of something important.

Tuesday, February 13 – 7 PM at the Jesuit Center. If you sing, bring a voice. Bring a friend. If you play, bring your instrument. (We have a piano.) Let's see what might happen. RSVP not necessary but certainly appreciated, so we can plan. Have enough chairs. Maybe snacks? Things like that.

And let us continue to pray for one another.



One of the great traditions of the Church is the heritage of our Latin Mass, harkening back to a time when a common language was seen as a symbol of a universal Church. The weekend Mass on February 17 and 18 (the last weekend before Lent) will be celebrated in Latin. We will have a special Order of Worship available so that all can participate. (Note: This is NOT the Tridentine Mass, which can only be celebrated

with special permission, but the current Mass celebrated in Latin.

Readings and the homily will be in English.) A reception in the parish hall will follow the Mass.
