RAMBLINGS OF THE REVEREND REDACTOR

I probably should have used this last week, but even though it is after the fact, I can't resist.



Of course, while it does teach a lesson in proper punctuation, the lesson in the real story is twofold. The first is, of course, Abraham's trust in God, that God's will is the most important. The second – contrary to the humor of the cartoon – is Isaac's trust in his father.

In the real world, that is how trust grows. We begin as small children, and we instinctively trust everyone and everything. We learn, in time, that there are some things of which we need to be cautious. But our parents are usually – unfortunately not always – the foundation for

trust. We learn to trust the people who carry us, who throw us up and catch us, who feed us and take us to wonderful places – and we learn to trust the people they trust.

We go to school and we are taught to trust the teachers. About the same time we also go to Church, and we learn to trust God. As we grow into adults, we have our own experiences of God (hopefully) and in those we learn a different kind of trust. As adults – whether or not we are parents or teachers – we communicate trust to others. We teach by example, often without realizing it and people who trust us will instinctively trust the people or the things they see we trust. I cannot count the number of people who have converted to the Catholic Church because of the people they have come to know who are Catholics. For all the programs and materials and courses that have been "designed" to encourage people to come to the faith, nothing has ever been as effective as the example of and friendship with Catholics who truly practice our faith.

We may not think of it as "trust" but when we are little, we often think or say, "I want to be like him. I want to be just like her." Sometimes it is a famous person, sometimes a career person (I want to be a fireman, I want to be a doctor) – but the sub-text really is, "I want to be like _____." The greatest compliment one person can pay to another is to think – even if they don't say it – I want to be like you.

Of course, the ultimate step in that process is to be able to say – and mean it – I want to be like Jesus Christ. Now that is hard. Not just because He is the Son of God but because while He was both human and divine, we are only human. We have resources, we have knowledge and we know it can be done. There are thousands of example of people who have succeeded and most of us even know people in our own lives. That is the ultimate example of trust – to step out of the boat, to sell what you have and follow, to want to be like Jesus Christ. That is our call as Catholics – to want to be like Jesus Christ.

Let us continue to pray for one another.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION CLASSES

The first class of preparation for those who wish to make their First Holy Communion in 2020 will be held on Saturday, September 14, at 3:30 PM in the basement of the hall next to St. Mary of Nazareth Church, Sweifieh. We will gather outside the hall prior to that so we can enter together exactly at 3:30.

But before that – Fr. John needs to meet with the parents (at least one) of each child, and then he will schedule a meeting with the child at the family home, to determine if he thinks the child is ready. Both of these MUST be completed before the child is admitted to the program.

Candidates should be at least 7 years old, baptized in the Catholic Church and have a good command of English. Other requirements will be discussed at the meeting with the parents.

PILGRIMAGE TO MALTA

Registration deadline is 5 PM on Monday August 19th

Our planned trip will be from September 17 (Tuesday) returning on Saturday September 21. We will be back in time for First Communion class and Mass at Sweifieh. We will have Mass each day except Saturday. The basic cost is 700 JOD per person. That includes:

- Round trip air fare with Ryan Air from Amman to Malta and back to Amman in economy class with one 20KG suitcase and one 7KG carry on (assuming no change in the quoted rate prior to booking)
- 4 nights accommodation in 4 star hotel, double occupancy. Hotel has free wi-fi when available. For a single room there is a supplemental charge of 90 JOD. Breakfast each day is included.
- All transfers and excursions in A/C coach, and all entrance fees
- English speaking guide throughout the tours from day 1 to day 4
- 2 dinners (one on day 1 and the other on day 2)

This does NOT include:

- Tips, local and/or international telephone calls from the room/hotel, laundry, dry clean, mini bar, room service and any other not mentioned above
- Souvenirs, Drinks of any kind during the meals, water, Roaming mobile fees and charges
- Transfers from your home in Amman to Queen Alia Int'l Airport (QAIA) and back
- Lunch and dinner other than above (need to calculate approx 30 to 40 Euro per person per day)
- Visa fees (Europeans, North Americans and some Asians exempt from obtaining a visa in advance.
- Excess baggage weight charges and/or extra baggage charges
- In flight entertainment, purchases and/or meals
