

### Blessing of the Animals by Faith Shearin

At my daughter's Catholic school there is a blessing of the animals at which the children line up with their fat hamsters and gauzy goldfish, their dogs so old


they can barely climb the hill. They bring their cats with bald patches and their lizards sleeping in cages under a fake sun. In the line to the priest there are snakes

with white eyes and birds without songs. There are ant farms and worms and rats with long, exposed tails. The children wait hours for their animals to be blessed: for the priest's hand

to hover over the weight they carry. They bring shoe boxes full of turtles, hairy spiders, frogs with dry skin. I like watching my daughter

among the other children: her dog small in her arms, her gaze protective. Children believe in the power of animals, tucked into their feathers and shells; they believe

in blessings: the sprinkle of holy water, each tiny unexplained life.



# RAMBLINGS OF THE REVEREND REDACTOR

I have said it many times before, and it bears repeating – God will not do for you what you should do for yourself.

October, in addition to being one of two months dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary, is also Mission Month, and this year the Holy Father has placed a special emphasis on this. Those who asked have already been receiving daily reflections on this call, based on the Mass readings for the day. (And anyone who wants to start receiving them has only to send me an email.)

We are the hands of Christ in the world, and our call is to help bring people to Jesus – the knowledge of Him, and hopefully the love of Him and the acceptance of His invitation to salvation. In Jordan we don't "evangelize" but in history, it was the example of others that proved most successful in attracting people to the faith. "See how they love one another" was the observation that led others to name this new group "Christians," and St. Francis of Assis (whose feast we celebrate this month as well) is noted for his saying "Preach the Gospel. When absolutely necessary, use words."

The intention of the Holy Father for this month is that the Holy Spirit will engender a new missionary "spring." Whatever your call in life, God has already given you the gifts to fulfill <u>your</u> mission. Your call, of course, is to figure out what those gifts are and how best to use them. Jesus sent out his disciples, and after His death, His apostles, His most trusted companions, scattered to the four corners of the globe to keep extending the invitation.

It is possible to be a "missionary" in solitude and in private. One of the two patrons saints of missionaries is St. Terese, the Little Flower, who spent most of her adult life in a cloister. (The other, of course, is St. Francis Xavier, the Jesuit patron of our chapel, who spent much of <u>his</u> life working the missions overseas.) But in most cases, "mission" involves other people – which means going out and getting involved in something. Yes, I am reminding you of the many opportunities in our parish to help serve.

But if you are involved in good works in other places, the challenge is to be sure that you are doing it as — and are seen to be doing it as — a Catholic. Our Novice Master reminded us early in our training that even if you had been a teacher before entering the Society of Jesus, teaching as a Jesuit should be something different. As a Jesuit you should bring something to your teaching that comes out of your faith, your experience, your relationship with God. The same is true of being a Catholic.

Whatever you do – doing it "as a Catholic" should somehow make it different. It should reflect in your "doing" of it something of who you are as a Catholic. Not preaching – not trying to convert – but simply living in everything you do the faith that you hold, the relationship you hopefully have with Jesus Christ. "Doesn't she do great work?" Yes, well, you know – she is a Catholic. That, I believe, might be the greatest compliment someone else could pay.

Let us continue to pray for one another and for the good we hope to do in this world, and especially in this month.
