RAMBLINGS OF THE REVEREND REDACTOR

Well, we made it through another Advent, another Christmas, another New Year's and all the assorted Feasts and Solemnities that the Church schedules at this time of the year and there is a sense of pause. There is the Presentation and the Blessing of Throats – and of course St. Patrick's Day – but the next really big moment is Ash Wednesday. (Reminder – for us in Jordan that means March 4 - one week <u>after</u> the rest of the universal Church. If you bought a parish calendar, you know this. If not…well, you know what to do.)

Lest you get too comfortable – from Sunday the 12th of January to Ash Wednesday is only 52 days. Then First Confessions – Holy Week and Easter – First Communion and SUMMER!!!!! Where did the time go?

In a recent homily at the weekday Mass I said I did NOT want to hear about resolutions, things people were going to do in 2020. The reason, I explained, is because if we are serious about doing something – we do it. We make it a part of our lives, our schedules, we put it high on the list of priorities and we practice. There is nothing magic about a date or a celebration that is suddenly going to galvanize us to do what we say we are going to do but don't do. It's a lovely thought but it borders on magic – if I take this pill, I will get thin. If I say these words my life will change. In the U.S. in about four weeks, there will be a rash of gym memberships for sale on Facebook going at highly discounted rates, because people who started out with high hopes have dropped out.

You're smiling, aren't you? Of course, because we recognize this in ourselves. Unfortunately, all too often God is one of the casualties of this kind of thinking. I meant to go to Mass last week; I can't seem to find the time to get to confession; I know we were late for Mass today but.... If it's really important, you make it happen. You leave early – you cancel something else -you make it happen. The attendance at the Christmas Eve Mass was 282 people. Mass on Christmas morning - 64. Mass on the morning of January 1st – a Solemnity in the calendar of the Church and a legal holiday was 41, which fit in the small chapel at the Jesuit Center. Says something about priorities.

I don't say this to scold, but to encourage an honest look at what your priorities really are. There was a really interesting – and sometimes heated – exchange on Facebook recently when someone asked, "What does it mean to be a 'practicing Catholic'?" The variety of points of view were fascinating, including people who didn't think that attending Mass on a regular basis was important, that confession wasn't required to receive Holy Communion, that there was nothing different about receiving "communion" at a Protestant Church than at a Catholic Church – and this from people who maintained they were "practicing Catholics."

How well do YOU know your faith? If you are still looking for a "New Year's resolution" that doesn't involve a gym membership, learning more about your Catholic faith might be a valuable way to go. Last May at the First Communion Mass I read a list of questions, and many adults confessed they had not known the answers. The First Communion children did. So maybe bringing your level of real knowledge of the faith up to that of a First Communion candidate might be a strong first step. Right now there are two adult groups that meet on Tuesday and another that meets on Saturday afternoon, and with enough interest, another group could be created. Depends on – well, depends on you.

And let us continue to pray for one another.

IT'S THAT TIME OF YEAR

When everybody is making resolutions, determined to do better in 2020.

If one of your resolutions is to be more active in the Parish – which is a WONDERFUL resolution – these are some of the areas where you can participate and make a difference.

LECTORS –The men and women who proclaim the Word of God at Mass. You need to take one workshop to be formally installed, about 90 minutes.

ALTAR SERVERS – Open to boys and girls, men and women. One training session about 60 minutes depending on the number of people involved. It is a special privilege to assist the priest at the altar and not just for young people but all ages.

EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION – Only open to men, to help distribute the Body of Christ at Mass, and when necessary, to take Holy Communion to those who are sick and housebound or in the hospital. Two training sessions, about 90 minutes each.
