

### FOR JANUARY

Prayer intention for Evangelisation Promotion of World Peace

We pray that Christians, followers of other religions, and all people of goodwill may promote peace and justice in the world.





In journalism, the norm used to be that the first sentence should try and provide the basic information for the important 5 questions – Who, what, when, where and why. So before I add any additional explanations: Who – Fr. John Sheehan, SJ What – will be leaving Jordan When – probably on March 3<sup>rd</sup> Where – to return to the United States for a new assignment Why – because his appointment from the Patriarch's office expires on March 1<sup>st</sup>, and the Near East Province has assumed responsibility for the works of the Jesuits in Jordan.

We all knew from the day I arrived that my appointment was only for three years, although at the time, I assumed that when a new Jesuit Provincial would be appointed, my appointment would be renewed. I did not know that plans were underway to transfer the responsibility for the work of the Jesuits in Jordan to the Near East Province. It makes sense, and while no one can predict the future, I certainly think it will be a good thing for both the Jesuit Province and for Catholics in Amman, as the Jesuits will be able to reach out more to a wider range of Catholics in Jordan in more ways than we have been able to.

Jesuits go where the need is greatest, and our Provincial Superiors make those decisions. In my life as a Jesuit, I have not always seen the wisdom in some of those choices, but in my own experience, every place I have been sent, I have been present at a time and place where I was able to make a difference. I don't know that I have made much difference here – certainly there is an impressive list of things I was NOT able to accomplish, things that failed or never got off the ground. Hopefully I did more good than harm, and again, from a personal perspective, I learned a lot. I don't know if I was able to change Jordan in any meaningful way, but certainly Jordan has changed me.

Part of me is disappointed. When I had been in Jordan for about six months someone asked me how I liked it, and without thinking, I answered that I could die here – meaning I could easily see spending the rest of my life here. But God – through my Provincial – has other plans, and I leave with confidence that this parish will be well-taken care of. In the next months there are four Jesuits in residence, and two other priests who will be visiting as part of a sabbatical. The Near East Province has committed to sending another priest in the summer of 2020, so I know you will be well looked after.

**There is one thing I would ask** – besides taking care of one another and being gentle with the priests, of course - I have several boxes of books and music, and several framed pictures I would like to take back with me. Anyone with any contacts for shipping that do not involve spending days at Customs and forking over large sums of money – I would love to hear from you. I will be spending the extra cash to travel with three and perhaps even four suitcases – but the books and music and larger items present a separate problem. All assistance eagerly accepted. I should know shortly how many boxes I'm talking about.

Of course at this point I have no idea where I am going or what doing. I am still Pastor until March 1<sup>st</sup>, so don't try anything (<sup>(C)</sup>) And my personal email remains: (johnRsheehan@yahoo.com). I'll be getting a new phone, which means a new phone number, so assume the old What's App and message is dead. As I/we get more details about the transition, I'll let you know. In the meantime – Let us continue to pray for one another.

#### **ANNUAL REPORT for 2019**


